

1. Please be advised that the man known as Johnny Chattin, claiming to be the Attorney General of the Georgia Tribe of Eastern Cherokee, is a Fraud, and is NOT a member of the State recognized Georgia Tribe of Eastern Cherokee. The Georgia Tribe of Eastern Cherokee, have no Tribal lands and therefor have no need for a Tribal court. Mr. Taylor claims to be the Chief of the Fake Georgia Tribe he represents. His activities have been brought to the attention of the Eastern Band leadership to no avail. The Eastern Band should be ashamed of themselves for allowing this fraud to be run from a residence on the Qualla Boundary.
